To use the handicap accessible parking spaces on campus you need:

1. A valid SUNY Geneseo parking permit

AND

2. A valid handicap permit (hangtag or plates) from your town **OR** Parking & Transportation Services

If you do not already have a handicap permit (hangtag or plates) from your town:

- Need to obtain a prescription or statement from your physician or Lauderdale Health Center stating that:
 - a. You need temporary handicap parking
 - b. IT MUST CONTAIN AN EXPIRATION OR EXPECTED RECOVERY DATE

If you do not already have a SUNY Geneseo parking permit:

- Students: need to purchase a decal for the length of time the handicap permit is needed:
 - One to four weeks: \$9.00 temporary permit
 - Four to eight weeks: \$31.25 temporary permit
 - o Eight to fifteen weeks: \$62.50 (or current rate) semester decal
 - o Fifteen weeks or longer: \$120.00 (or current rate) full year decal
- Faculty and staff: need to purchase a decal at the current rate for your union/profession
- Visitors to the College: need to obtain a free temporary permit

- If the handicap spaces are full in Lots A, B, C, D, E, G, I, L, R, S, U, V, or College Circle:
 - You may park in any other regular space within that lot

Parking & Transportation Services and the University Police Department strictly enforce parking regulations. Individuals are subject to the campus parking regulations and NYS Vehicle and Traffic Law. Handicap plates or permits may be used to park in handicap spaces **only when the person issued the plates or permit rides in or drives the vehicle**. Persons who park illegally in these spaces violate Section 1203-c(4) of the NYS Vehicle and Traffic Law. Violators on campus may receive any of the following: parking ticket, permit revocation, towing of the vehicle, and/or VTL ticket. Use of the term 'handicap' is the designation as stipulated in the NYS Vehicle and Traffic Law.
